 She carried a cargo of Christmas trees.
 The Simmons was in command of Capt. Henry
 Schueneman and carried a crew
 all told, of sixteen men. Mar. Rev. Dec. 1912
 500 gross tons carrying capacity
 Life saving service 1913, Nov. 23, 1912. Schooner Rouse Simmons, tonnage 205, Michigan

 The schooner Rouse Simmons must
 have foundered in the gale on Lake
 Michigan on Dec. 4 with all hands as a
 search of the lake by the revenue
 cutter Tuscarora had failed to find
 any trace of her. Sixteen lives lost.
